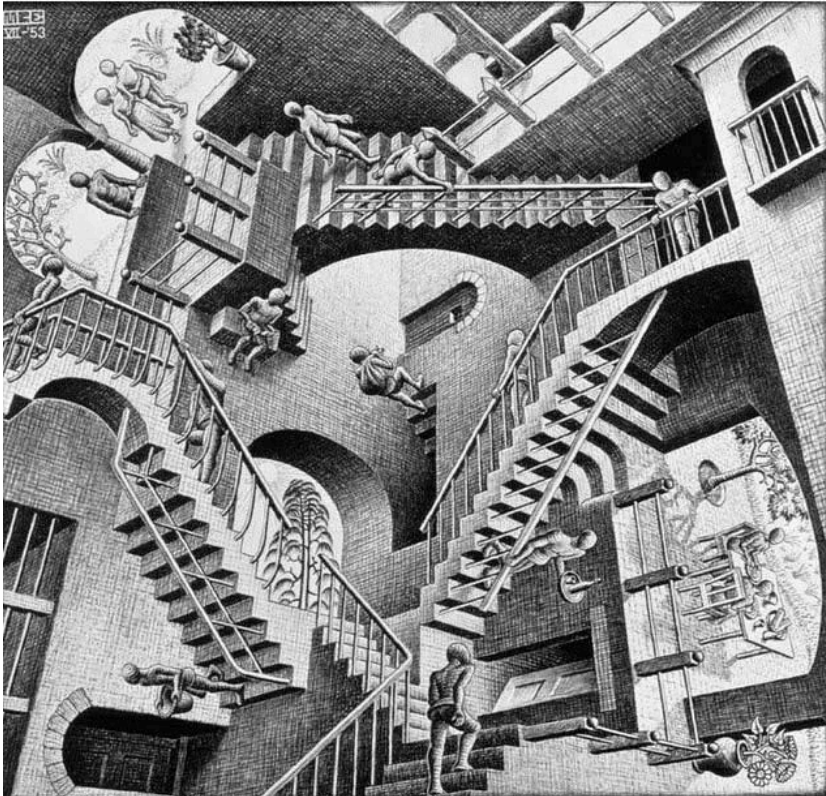

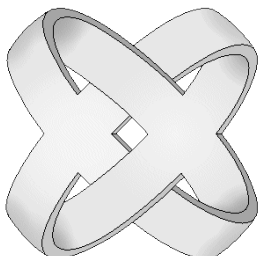


FROM PUZZLES AND PARADOXES TO PHILOSOPHY
