The Deborah S. Moore Service Awards recognize exemplary service and outstanding volunteerism by students and clubs. The Deborah S. Moore Service Award may be presented to a student only once while they are enrolled at NC State; all registered student organizations will be eligible each year.

A typewritten recommendation should be attached to this completed form and returned to the address given at the bottom. Please limit your recommendation to one page, front and back, per nominee. A selection committee comprised of NC State students will interview 3 to 5 nominees from the Category 1 nominations to interview. Interviews will take place on Thursday, April 6, 2006 between 6 and 9 pm. The winners shall be selected after the interviews. A panel of staff members will judge category 2 awards.

AWARD CRITERIA – Recommendation Letter Information

- * **Outstanding Student of the Year** – Please comment on the scope of this student’s exemplary service over the course of their college career. Include types and locations of service and how they have grown through their experience.
- * **Outstanding Student Organization of the Year** – Please comment on the scope of service or philanthropy events this organization has participated in over the past academic year. Include types and locations of service, the impact on organization members and what was learned through participation in service.
- * **Outstanding One Time Volunteer Event** - This award will recognize a one-time event that had great impact on the community or an agency. Please comment on the planning as well as execution of the event, what the benefit was to the community or agency as well as the impact on organization members or NC State students.
- * **Outstanding Community Service Program** - This award recognizes an ongoing project (i.e.: weekly participation with an agency or program by a club) that had great impact on the community or an agency as well as on the club members. Please comment on what the weekly service was, what the benefit was to the community or agency as well as the impact on organization members or NC State students.
