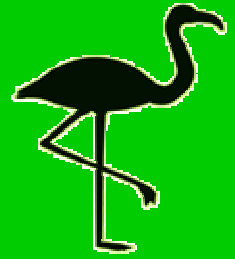

The Project:

Waste Reduction and Recycling, along with Campus Arts Council, are encouraging students to individually or in groups, enter into a competition to make a statue or artistic sculpture out of recyclable materials in order to show what they feel represents campus sustainability here at NC State.

To enter:

- * Submit a \$10.00 entry fee
- * Must provide your own materials
- * Create a piece no larger than 4' by 7'
- * Submit a short paragraph describing what materials were used, who was involved, and what inspirations you used to create your product.
- * All entries are due no later than April 18th at the campus Waste Reduction & Recycling Center by 3:00 PM.

*There is a limit of 35 entries.

The winning entry will receive a prize basket and all entries will be displayed in the North Gallery on the 2nd floor of Talley student center on Thursday April 24th from 6-9 PM.
