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Undergraduate Research: Where Can I Begin?

A number of current UHP students from various academic disciplines are spending their summer engaging in undergraduate research and scholarship. From the east coast to the west coast, from NASA to Research Triangle Park, UHP students are all over the country and abroad making tremendous strides in undergraduate research.

When you think of research you may have images of laboratories, microscopes, petri dishes, and introverted scientists. One may think of biotechnology, cancer biology, nanoscience, the AIDS epidemic,

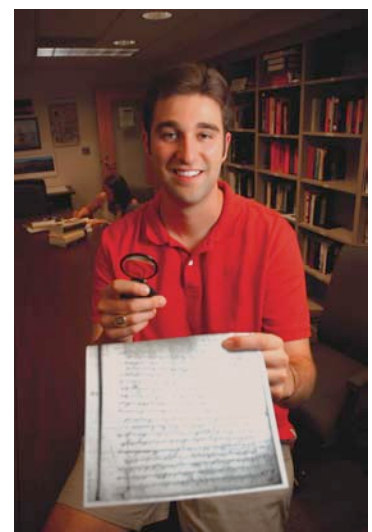
global warming, or alternative fuels. These topics are all cutting edge research topics, but students in the University Honors Program are encouraged to go even further by broadening their understanding of research and how it applies to their particular interests.

The UHP is marketed to high achieving students from all academic programs. The UHP challenges its participants to brainstorm about any activity that would allow them to form new knowledge. Sites for research opportunities are virtually limitless, including laboratories, museums, manuscript collections, archeological sites, oral history archives, and libraries. Research involves traveling to foreign places to understand the influence of place and time on an author's work, involves conducting surveys, interviews or focus groups. It may entail creating a new design, understanding the context of a musical composition by learning to play period instruments, and exploring the different production techniques for dramas.

By now you should have a clearer understanding of what we mean when we say research. Research is the generation of new knowledge. Research can be conducted in every scholarly discipline. Undergraduate research means that the undergraduate student is beginning to engage in the magnificent deed of generat-

ing knowledge, an opportunity that wasn't popular or readily available for the undergraduate student ten or twenty years ago. Being on the cutting edge and thinking outside the box when it comes to research is not just a notion, it is strongly encouraged and supported in the UHP.

UHP students who engage in research work closely with faculty members or experienced professionals in the field. UHP students move beyond the traditional means of passively obtaining knowledge in the classroom to embarking on an experiential learning experience that potentially knows no limits.



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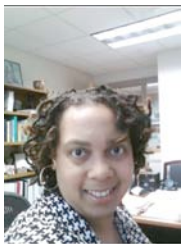

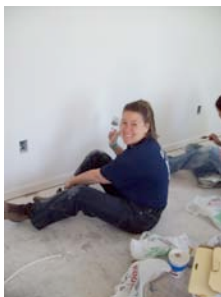

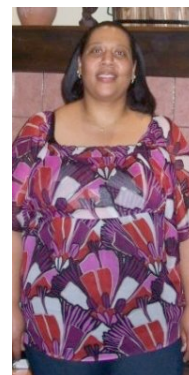
