New Student Orientation, a one and a half day program that is required for all first-year students, will help you prepare for your transition into college life as well as the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead—intellectually, emotionally, academically, and socially.

New Student Orientation takes place from late June through the end of July. You will need to attend the session that corresponds with the college into which you have been admitted.

New Student Orientation features both academic and social components that include:

- Academic advising, first-semester schedule planning, and course registration
- AllCampus card processing (your student ID)
- Overviews of campus life and student services

- An overnight stay in a residence hall with other new students

## What to Bring to Orientation

Transportation information, directions to the NC State campus and the Orientation Parking Permit are located online at [www.ncsu.edu/orientation/firstyear](http://www.ncsu.edu/orientation/firstyear). The Orientation Parking Permit must be displayed on your car at all times during Orientation.

What to Pack: Please leave electronic items (iPod, laptop, etc.) and other valuables at home.

- Alarm clock
- Pen and paper
- Pillow
- Sleeping bag or long twin sheets & blanket
- Towel, washcloth, toiletries, and shower shoes
- Valid driver's license or other form of picture ID (to have your AllCampus ID made)**
- Copies of your AP/IB/SAT II scores if available
- Sweater or light jacket as some buildings can be chilly
- Make sure you know your Unity ID and password and have answered your three security questions

## Cost of Orientation

The mandatory Orientation fee is charged to all first-year students to cover the costs of Orientation. It will be included in your Fall tuition bill.

## Orientation Arrival and Check-In

Orientation Check-in is from 8:00–9:00 a.m. at Lee Residence Hall. Once you arrive on campus using the directions provided, Orientation signs will direct you to the Lee Lot or West Lot on Sullivan Drive, where you will be able to park during Orientation.

Along with checking in for Orientation, you will have the opportunity to check in to your room for the night. You will be issued a suite key and a room key for use during Orientation. Lee and Sullivan are non-smoking residence halls. Students must abide by all University policies, along with state and federal laws, and will be held responsible for their actions.

Meals for students during Orientation (lunch and dinner on the first day and breakfast on the second day) are included in the New Student Orientation fee and will be served at Fountain Dining Hall, located next to Lee Residence Hall.

## Policy Regarding Alcoholic Beverages At Orientation

**NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED!** Orientation participants are subject to the Code of Student Conduct, which can be found on the Web at [www.ncsu.edu/student\\_conduct](http://www.ncsu.edu/student_conduct). It mandates that consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages by all persons under the age of 21 is strictly forbidden. This is also the law in the State of North Carolina. Students who disregard this mandate will be held accountable for their behavior and disciplinary actions from the University will result.

## Orientation Check-Out

Orientation check-out will be located in the breezeway between Lee and Sullivan Residence Halls. You will need to remove all of your belongings from your room and make sure you return your room and suite keys to the check out table. Failure to return keys at Check-out will result in a replacement fee of up to \$110 PER KEY.

# New Student Checklist

## Every Student Must...

### Reserve Your Space at Orientation

You must register for Orientation from your **WolfPAW** account via <https://wolfpaw.ncsu.edu/>. Click on the "Orientation" link on the left column of the WolfPAW page. Read the instructions, select, and submit the Orientation you wish to attend. Only the session(s) available to you (based on your college and/or major) are offered as options. Review your Application Status screen in **WolfPAW** or your acceptance letter from Undergraduate Admissions if you are unsure of your college. Contact New Student Orientation at 919.515.1234 immediately should you have a conflict with attending your designated Orientation session.

### Submit Final Academic Transcript(s)

You must request that your high school counselor send your final high school transcript to Undergraduate Admissions immediately following your graduation. If you are enrolled in college courses, you must have your college Registrar's Office send an official copy of your final transcript to the Undergraduate Admissions. Failure to submit a final, official transcript will result in cancellation of your registration. Mail transcripts to: NC State Office of Undergraduate Admissions, Campus Box 7103, Raleigh, NC 27695-7103.

### Complete the Medical History and Immunization Form

Complete and return the Medical History and Immunization Form that has been sent to you by Undergraduate Admissions, or download this form from: [www.ncsu.edu/student\\_health/immunizations/immunization.html](http://www.ncsu.edu/student_health/immunizations/immunization.html). Students must have these records on file at NC State. **Please note under North Carolina regulations, a student must be dropped from classes and a hold placed on future registration until the immunization requirements are met.** Return the completed form by May 30 for the fall semester, or within 30 days of your acceptance. You may submit copies of your official immunization records and report of medical history and immunizations via FAX to Student Health at 1.877.221.6278 (NCSU). Contact Student Health Services at 919.515.7233; by email at [immunizations@ncsu.edu](mailto:immunizations@ncsu.edu); or visit their website: [www.ncsu.edu/student\\_health/](http://www.ncsu.edu/student_health/).

### Access Your Unity Account

Your Unity account gives you access to numerous online resources available at NC State. To obtain your Unity ID, log in to <https://wolfpaw.ncsu.edu/> with your WolfPAW username and password. Your initial Unity ID password is the last four digits of your ID number (found on the WolfPAW page) followed by the month and day of your birth (mmdd). **Be sure you know your Unity ID and password when you come to Orientation as you will need them to register for classes!**

You need your Unity ID and password to access your email as well as online student services (e.g., e-billing, financial aid, Registration and Records) available via the MyPack Portal (<http://mypack.ncsu.edu>). The first time you visit the Portal, you will be required to change your password from the default one. You should also setup your security questions and answers so that future password resets, if needed, can be done over the phone by Help Desk staff. For answers to questions concerning your account, computing access, ResNet (networking for on-campus residents) or other computing questions, visit <http://oit.ncsu.edu> or <http://oit.ncsu.edu/unityid> or contact the NC State Help Desk at [help@ncsu.edu](mailto:help@ncsu.edu) or 919.515.HELP (4357).

### Access Your Tuition and Fees Information

Tuition and fees statement are not mailed to students. Instead, you will receive an email notification from [e\\_bill@ncsu.edu](mailto:e_bill@ncsu.edu) that an eBILL has been posted to your account. If you use anti-spam or filtering software, please add [e\\_bill@ncsu.edu](mailto:e_bill@ncsu.edu) to your trusted sender list. You access your bill via MyPack Portal.

**Tuition and Fees must be paid by the date posted on your billing statement to avoid schedule cancellation.** It is the responsibility of each student to make full payment or complete financial aid information prior to the posted deadline. Approved Financial Aid awards, scholarships, and sponsorships will be noted on the account, and only amounts exceeding the award must be paid to prevent cancellation. If you decide not to attend NC State, you must notify the Department of Registration & Records **in writing no later** than the first day of classes. You will be responsible for any charges on your account until an Official Withdrawal is completed.

## If You Need to....

### Request a Curriculum (College) Change

Requests to change the college into which you were accepted must be submitted to and approved by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions prior to June 15. You cannot change your college after June 15 or during Orientation. Email your request to [undergrad\\_admissions@ncsu.edu](mailto:undergrad_admissions@ncsu.edu) or mail to Undergraduate Admissions, NC State, Campus Box 7103, Raleigh, NC 27695.

### Submit AP/IB and College Credits

Students taking Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) exams should have scores sent directly to the Undergraduate Admissions (College Board Code 5496). Students who took college courses through a dual enrollment program need to send official college transcripts upon completion of the courses. Undergraduate Admissions does not accept scores from high school or college transcripts. For more information regarding AP/IB credits, visit: <http://admissions.ncsu.edu/placement.htm>.

### Apply for Scholarships and Financial Aid

The Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid (OSFA) assists students with applying for and securing financial assistance. Our priority filing date for financial aid is March 1, 2009, but you can still submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) after that date for consideration.

### Complete Your University Housing Application

University Housing provides on-campus residential facilities for approximately 8,000 residents. A variety of residential options are available to accommodate diverse student interests and needs. Before an assignment can be made, students must both complete the Housing Application and pay the Admissions Advanced Enrollment Deposit. The Housing Application can be accessed by logging into the MyPack Portal and selecting *Student Self Service University Housing*. Once you are on the Housing Self-Service page, select the *Housing Application* button.

### Get Phone and Cable Service for your Room

The Office of Information Technology provides a comprehensive optional local phone and cable television package for students living on campus. Prepaid long distance service is also available. ### **Update Your Home and/or Email Address**

It is very important that your address and phone information are kept current with the university. It's easy to do using the MyPack Portal. Enrolled students can update their personal information (address, phone, emergency contacts, etc.) through the portal using their Unity ID and password. To access MyPack Portal, go to [www.ncsu.edu/registrar](http://www.ncsu.edu/registrar) and click the MyPack icon. Once you have logged into the portal, simply click *For Students*, find the *Personal Info* area, and select *Contact Info*. **Please be sure to sign up to receive emergency text messages, which may be sent during campus safety emergencies.**

### **Campus Parking Permit Information**

Parking on campus requires a valid NC State Parking Permit. Permits are sold online beginning July 1. Eligibility to purchase a permit is based on student's credit hours on file with Registration and Records as of late June. Freshmen are eligible to purchase a parking permit; however most will be sold off-site storage permits. ### **Purchase or Upgrade Your Computer**

### **Purchase Your Textbooks**

NC State Bookstores offers a "Get Booked Early" program. All you need to do is fill out the form with your student ID and account information and the staff will pull your course schedule from the Registration & Records database, create your own personal book list, pull all of your textbooks from the textbook sales floor and hold them for you until move-in weekend. # Placement testing information

## Mathematics Achievement Test

Successful completion of freshman year mathematics is one of the best early indicators of ultimate graduation from NC State. For that reason, we require admitted freshmen to take a test to determine proper placement in math prior to attending New Student Orientation and registering for fall classes.

One option is to take the SAT Subject Test - Mathematics Level 2 in the spring prior to attending orientation and have your scores reported electronically to NC State (*code #5496*). More information about test registration and deadlines is available at <http://www.collegeboard.com>.

Alternatively, you may take the NC State online Mathematics Skill test. To ensure proper course placement you should plan to complete this assessment by June 1. To login and take the test you will need your Unity ID and password, which is assigned upon acceptance and displayed on your WolfPAW application status screen. There is no charge for this test, which is available at <https://www.webassign.net/ncsu/math.html>.

If you do not take the "SAT Subject Test - Mathematics Level 2" or the "NC State online Mathematics Skill test" you will not be allowed to register for a calculus course, which could result in a lower math placement and adversely affect your fall schedule.

The only exceptions to the placement test requirements will be for:

- students who have College Board Advanced Placement Calculus scores of 2 or better
- students who have completed transferable math credits through dual enrollment at a college or university
- students who graduated from the NC School of Science and Mathematics and have letters of placement
- students enrolled in a 2-year Agricultural Institute program (separate math placement testing will be conducted at Orientation)

## Foreign Language Placement Information

Students enrolling in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences (CHASS), the First Year College (FYC), or the College of Management (MGMT) are encouraged to take the SAT II in a Foreign Language (along with their Math SAT II) so that they will know their foreign language placement before attending Orientation. Students should make arrangements with their high school guidance counselor to take the Math and Foreign Language SAT II tests.

Students enrolling in CHASS, FYC, or MGMT who have not taken the SAT II or the AP test in a Foreign Language will be directed to take a placement test during Orientation. Students in all other colleges who did not meet the university FL\* 102 proficiency requirement (as explained), or who wish to take a foreign language, should take the placement test during Orientation.

Computerized placement tests in French, German, Spanish, and Latin are offered during Orientation. For all other languages, students should go to <http://fil.chass.ncsu.edu/index.php> and contact the appropriate faculty member. If students are beginning a language they have never studied before, they should enroll in FL\* 101.

All students at NC State must demonstrate competency at the Elementary II level in a foreign language (FL\* 102) as a requirement for graduation. Students who do not meet the proficiency requirement as determined by a review of the student's high school record – two years of high school study of the same language with a grade of C [78] or better in each of the two years - must take a placement test. Students enrolling in programs in which the Intermediate I level (FL\* 201) is required (CHASS and MGMT), or students in other programs who wish to take a foreign language, must also take a placement test.

### From I-95 South (New York)

Take I-95 South to Exit 138, US-64 West toward Nashville/Raleigh. Take Exit 419, US-440 toward US-1/Wake Forest. Continue on US-440 to Exit 3 toward Meredith College. Turn left at the bottom of the exit ramp onto Hillsborough Street. Turn right onto Gorman Street (4<sup>th</sup> stop light), then the next left onto Sullivan Drive. Follow the Orientation Parking signs.

### From I-95 North (South Carolina)

Take I-95 North to I-40 West. Follow I-40 to Gorman Street (exit 295). Turn right onto Gorman Street and then right onto Sullivan Drive (sixth stop light). Follow the Orientation Parking signs.

### From US 64 West (Knightdale)

From Rocky Mount via US-64: Take US 64 West toward Raleigh. Take Exit 419, US-440 toward US-1/Wake Forest. Continue on US-440 to Exit 3 toward Meredith College. Turn left at the bottom of the exit ramp onto Hillsborough Street. Turn right onto Gorman Street (4<sup>th</sup> stop light) then the next left onto Sullivan Drive. Follow the Orientation Parking signs.

### From US 70 East (Durham)

Take US 70 East to Raleigh. Take I-440 South Outer Beltline to Western Blvd. (exit 2A). After exiting on Western Blvd., turn left onto Gorman Street (third stop light), and then right onto Sullivan Drive. Follow the Orientation Parking signs.

### From I-40 East (Chapel Hill)

Take I-40 East to Raleigh. At the I-40/ Wade Avenue split, stay on I-40 and follow to Gorman Street (exit 295). Turn left onto Gorman Street and right onto Sullivan Drive (seventh stop light). Follow the Orientation Parking signs.

### From 401 North (Fuquay Varina)

Take 401 North to Raleigh. Take I-40 West to Gorman Street (exit 295). Turn right onto Gorman Street and then right onto Sullivan Drive (sixth stop light). Follow the Orientation Parking signs.

### From US 1 South (Wake Forest)

Take US 1 South to Raleigh. Take I-440 West/US 1 South toward Sanford. Follow to Western Blvd. (exit 2A). After exiting on Western Blvd., turn left onto Gorman Street (third stop light), and then right onto Sullivan Drive. Follow the Orientation Parking signs.
