

Continuing of Undergraduate Enrollment

What Stays the Same:

1. The Continuation Scale
 - a. 1-59 Hours Attempted: Min GPA of 1.8
 - b. 60 or more Hours Attempted: Min GPA of 2.0
2. Students will remain eligible to continue until they have attempted 12 hours
3. Suspended students are required to take a break in enrollment

What Has Changed:

1. Immediate Suspension Criteria: Immediate suspension in Fall, Spring or Summer occurs if TGPA is below 1.0 and student has attempted at least 12 hours.
 - a. Students in this scenario may not enroll in Distance Education, Summer School or Independent Study courses during their enrollment break
2. Elimination of "no risk" summer school: Students who fail to meet the minimum requirements of the Continuation Scale will be suspended at the end of Spring or Summer.
3. Early warning/intervention: Students who have a TGPA of at least 2.0 but a SGPA below 1.0 will be placed on Academic Warning and are subject to the Timely Advising Requirement

Readmission of Academic Suspended Students

What Has Changed:

1. Students who are granted readmission after their FIRST suspension will be readmitted on Academic Warning status (instead of Probation status).
 - a. Student readmitted on Warning are eligible for Financial Aid.
 - b. Students readmitted on Warning must maintain a SGPA of at least 2.5 or they will be suspended again.
2. Retroactive withdrawals do not impact past Suspension status
