

NCSU International Course on Poultry Production

The Department of Poultry Science has offered an International Course on Poultry Production each year beginning in 2007. This is a one-week learning opportunity held at both main campus facilities and Lake Wheeler Road Field Laboratory during the second week of May. The objective of this course is to provide updated scientific and technical information and hands-on experience to improve commercial poultry production. The course is a unique training for the international poultry industry with emphasis on breeder, incubation and hatchery management, poultry nutrition and feed mill technology, grow out of broilers and turkeys, waste management, poultry health and welfare. The participants in this course receive classroom instruction, laboratory exercises and tours to commercial poultry facilities in North Carolina.

Fifty-eight people from 23 countries and five continents have participated in this course. The course is also open to US poultry producers and allied industry interested in learning more about the different sectors of the poultry industry. We expect to have our next course on May 11 - 15, 2009.
