INTERNATIONAL SPOUSE TEACHER'S GRANT-IN-AID- FALL SPRING 2004-2005

Please read this information carefully before completing the attached application form!

**THE GRANT-IN -AID:** This Grant-in-Aid is made possible through the generosity of the Gamma Omicron Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma. One Grant-in Aid, up to the total amount of \$1000.00, will be awarded to an international spouse to study a continuing education course or courses at a Triangle college or university in the fall-spring of 2004-2005.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Any spouse of a full-time degree-seeking N.C. State international student may apply. Both the applicant and the student must be holders of temporary visas. The applicant may not be a full-time student enrolled in a degree-program and must currently reside in the U.S. The recipient of the Grant-in-Aid must register for and subsequently complete, a continuing education course or courses in the fall-spring of 2004-2005. If you have applied for this award before, you are encouraged to re-apply, but previous recipients of this award are not eligible to apply again.

**APPLICATION:** Application for the award must be made on the attached form. Any additional information or supporting documents that the applicant feels might assist the selection committee in making a decision may be attached or included. Questions must be answered in English and written by the applicant. The application must be fully completed and legible (readable). Mail or hand-deliver the completed and signed application PLUS ONE COMPLETE PHOTOCOPY of the application to the address on the application form by the specified deadline below.

**DEADLINE:** No application will be accepted that is postmarked after December 15, 2004.

**SELECTION PROCESS:** The recipient of the Grant-in-Aid will be determined by a selection committee on the basis of the following:

- a) Potential benefit of the course to the recipient
- b) Potential for the recipient to teach what she learns with others upon return to the home country
- c) Potential for the recipient to share her cultural perspective with American classmates

Applicant's academic background, especially teaching, will be considered but not weighed heavily as a factor. The committee is interested primarily in the Grant-in-Aid as means of cultural exchange and personal benefit to a deserving individual. The decision of the committee is final.

**AWARD NOTIFICATION:** All applicants will be notified of the committee's decision at the beginning of the Spring 2005 semester.
