Advanced Grammar & Writing 1

Thursdays, February 12, 19, 26, March 12, 19

Here is your opportunity to learn grammar AND see how better grammar can improve your written English! In this advanced course, you will study proper verb conjugation in interrogative, negative, and affirmative forms. Among the tenses that will be viewed are present and past perfect, in addition to conditional forms, and frequency adverbs. All class sessions will emphasize writing with accurate grammar. (Instructor: TBA)

Advanced Speaking & Listening 1

Mondays, February 16, 23, March 9, 16, 23

In this highly interactive course, advanced students will develop and practice a variety of skills with authentic material. This class is for learners who can converse easily about general topics but want to further improve their speaking abilities and listening comprehension. Through discussion of different topics, you will expand and practice new vocabulary and conversational techniques. You will learn to identify the patterns of English conversation through various audio-visual activities and then apply your knowledge in improvisations, dialogues, and role-plays. (Instructor: Dunstan)

Advanced Pronunciation & Practice 1

Tuesdays, February 17, 24, March 10, 17, 24

This class will help you speak more clearly and be understood more fully by native English speakers. Focus will be on the entire utterance with some specific single sound help when necessary. Practice will include sound units, linking and other parts of rhythm and intonation. Included will be an evaluation of your speech and a pathway to improvement. Individual feedback will be given frequently. (Instructor: Quarterman)

TOEFL Prep: Listening and Speaking

Wednesdays, February 18, 25, March 11, 18, 25

This is part 1 of a two-part series on TOEFL iBT Preparation. This class aims to help English language learners understand and prepare for the next generation TOEFL Internet-based test (iBT). The TOEFL iBT tests all four language skills that are essential for effective communication: speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Part 1 will cover listening and speaking. You will be provided with tips and strategies to improve your scores. Diagnostic pre-tests and post-tests and full-length practice tests will also be given. This course is recommended only for students who have reached high intermediate or advanced English language proficiency, both oral and written. **Computer competence is a must.** (Instructor: Dempsey)

PREREQUISITE for all courses: You must have completed an advanced level English course or have equivalent skills. These advanced English courses are for those who are fluent in English or approaching near fluency (fluency = ability to converse with native English speakers without need to repeat oneself and be understood).

Advanced Grammar & Business Writing

Thursdays, March 26, April 2, 9, 16, 23

In this class you will gain strategies and techniques for successful business communication. We will practice a variety of examples of business writing common in U.S. companies. **Advanced Grammar & Writing 1 is not a prerequisite for this class.** (Instructor: TBA)

Advanced Speaking & Listening 2

Mondays, March 30, April 6, 13, 20, 27

As a student in this class, you will learn conversational techniques, responses to reading material, and speaking/listening practice through group activities and games. In addition, you will learn idiomatic expressions and some slang and use this in class during group work or presentations. This highly interactive class will focus on speaking clearly, and with a high degree of functionality and ease. **Advanced Speaking & Listening 1 is not a prerequisite for this class.** (Instructor: Dunstan)

Advanced Pronunciation & Practice 2

Tuesdays, March 31, April 7, 14, 21, 28

Continue to improve your speaking and English understanding in this course. Individualized analysis of pronunciation difficulties will be given, and strategies to self-correct will be taught. These include rate of speaking, individual sound problems, volume, and expression. Review and further practice of English rhythm and melody will be provided. There will be some individual presentations as well as small group practice. **Advanced Pronunciation & Practice 1 is not a prerequisite for this class.** (Instructor: Quarterman)

TOEFL Prep: Reading and Writing

Wednesdays, April 1, 8, 15, 22, 29

This is part 2 of a two-part series on TOEFL iBT Preparation. This class aims to help English language learners understand and prepare for the next generation TOEFL Internet-based test (iBT). The TOEFL iBT tests all four language skills that are essential for effective communication: speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Part 2 will cover the reading and writing sections. Students will be provided with tips and strategies to improve their scores. Diagnostic pre-tests and post-tests and full-length practice tests will also be given. This course is recommended only for students who have reached high intermediate or advanced English language proficiency, both oral and written. **Computer competence is a must. TOEFL Prep 1 is not a prerequisite for this class.** (Instructor: Dempsey)
