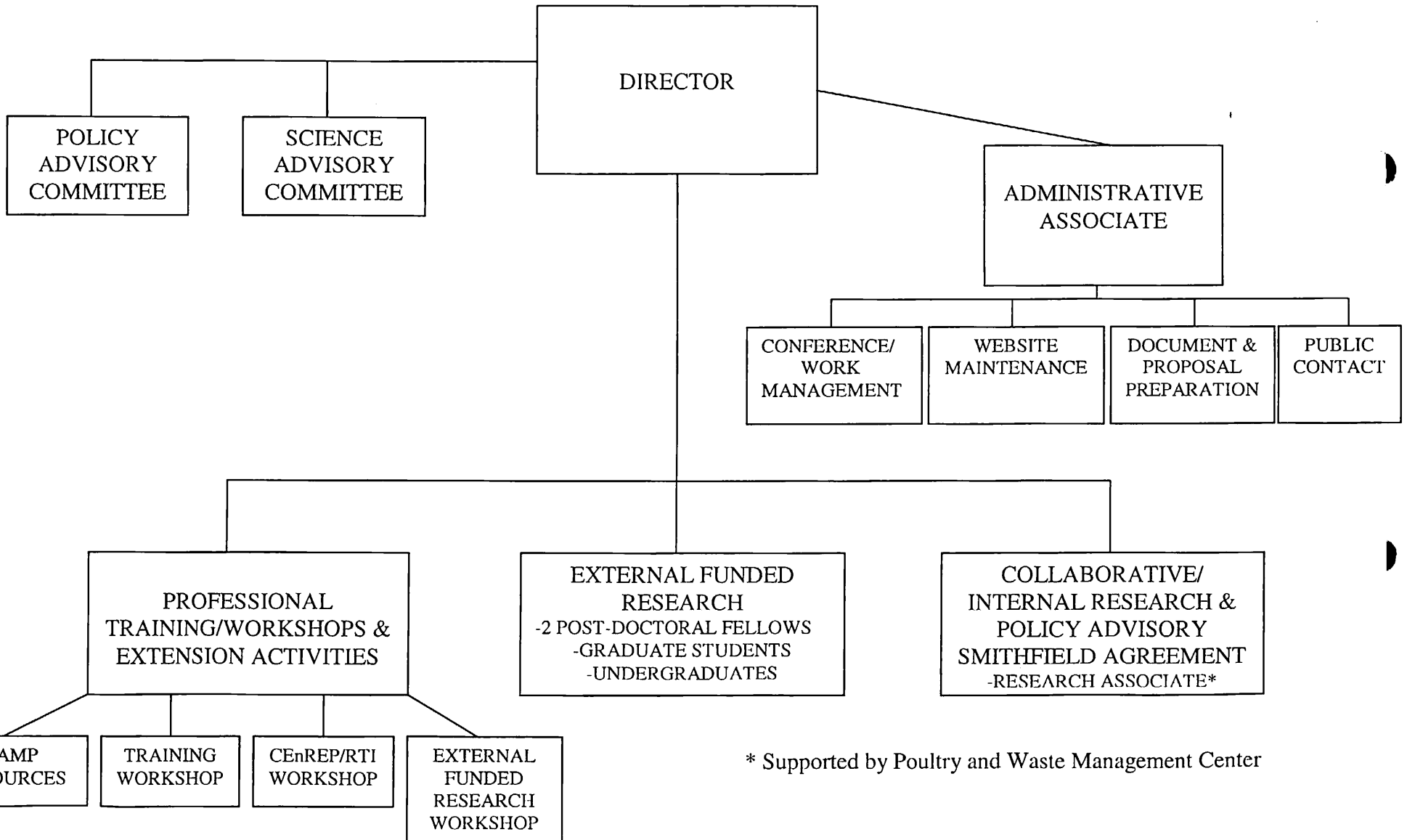
Faculty and Student Participation:

Table 1 identifies the recent past and current faculty and student participation in the Center's activities. In the two-year planning period, activities have been initiated with faculty from three colleges or schools outside CALS at NCSU (i.e., Management, PAMS and the School of Veterinary Medicine). In addition, research efforts have involved collaborative activities with several faculty at Triangle Universities and research institutes (including Duke University, UNC Chapel Hill, and RTI). Initial efforts have been made to encourage participation with faculty at UNC Wilmington, East Carolina University, and Davidson College.

Organizational Structure:

The proposed organizational set up of CEnREP is shown in Figure 1. The Director and the Center would report through the head of the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics to the Dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences.
