2009 Summer School Faculty Compensation Model**

- I. One academic department within the Division of Student Affairs (ROTC) will continue to utilize the current university compensation model (3.3% of base salary per credit hour) for the 2009 summer sessions.
- II. The Music Department will use a flat rate model for the 2009 summer sessions. A flat rate model will significantly reduce the administrative cost of delivering classes during summer sessions
- III. The Department of Physical Education will also utilize an alternative model (flat rate) for the 2009 summer sessions because of its lab-oriented offerings (e.g., one-hour classes).

Physical Education faculty compensation is provided for on-campus instruction at a flat rate of \$2,500 per credit hour (max summer compensation is \$10,000). The department uses contact hours to determine equivalent credit hours and full-load compensation, as most of our offerings are one-hour activity classes.

- Four Physical Education one credit-hour *activity classes* will equal 16.0 contact hours per week (4 credit hours and full academic load; \$10,000).
- One Physical Education two credit-hour *lecture class* (75-minute class 4 days per week) plus two activity classes will equal 14.0 contact hours per week (4 credit hours and full academic load; \$10,000).
- One Physical Education three credit-hour *lecture class* (90-minute class 5 days per week) plus two activity classes will equal 15.5 contact hours per week (5 credit hours and full academic load; \$10,000).
- In the event a Physical Education faculty member teaches all lecture classes, a full academic load would require three, two-hour lecture courses or two, three-hour lecture courses to be taught (6 credit hours and full academic load; \$10,000).
