### Directions to Haliwa-Saponi Indian Tribe Multipurpose Building, near Essex, NC

From Essex (also known as Five Points)  
Take Richardson Road to the west about two miles  
Take the first left off of Richardson Road, onto Bethlehem Road  
After about ½ mile, the road splits  
Stay to the right on Capps Farm Road  
After about ½ mile, there is a sign
